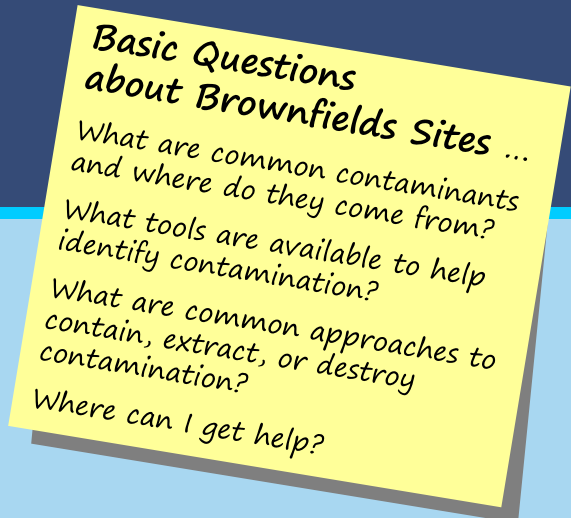


Brownfields Road Map to Understanding Options for Site Investigation and Cleanup 5th Edition

The Brownfields Road Map publication provides a general outline of the steps involved in the assessment and cleanup of a brownfields site and introduces brownfields stakeholders to the range of technology options and available resources. The 5th edition will be accompanied by a website that will provide direct access to technical resources and user-friendly tools.

The 5th edition will simplify the road to assessment and cleanup of brownfields sites with a **“back to the basics”** approach to help non-technical stakeholders and technical professionals:

- Walk through the “big picture” of managing a brownfields site from assessment to reuse (the road map)
- Understand typical types of contamination found at brownfields sites
- Ensure that site assessments and investigations are accurate, precise, and well-documented
- Consider factors that affect cleanup and redevelopment alternatives, including funding sources, regulatory guidelines, available technologies, and liabilities
- Make use of innovative, cost-saving approaches
- Engage local communities and respond to their concerns
